### **Fabric Requirements for 2 Hot Pads**

¼ Yard Background Fabric

Misc. Yellow, Tan, Blue, Gray, and Pink Scraps

2 Yards Ric Rac

Embroidery Thread

1 Sheet of Stick & Wash Away (Pellon 542)

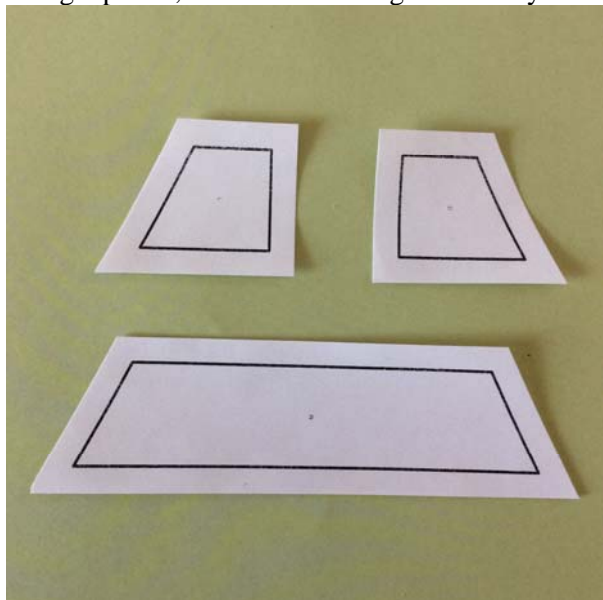
6 - ½" Buttons (Plus 2 - ¾" buttons for optional hanging loop)

2 - 12" Squares of Heat Resistant Batting (Insul-Bright)

¼ Yard Backing Fabric

5" Width of Fabric for Binding

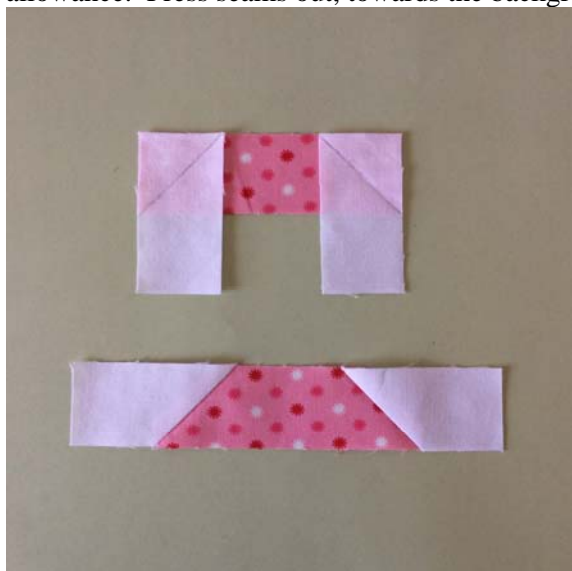
**For Templates:** Because of a few odd angles, this block requires 3 templates. Be sure to cut templates on the **OUTSIDE** (lighter) line (as this includes your ¼" seam allowance). The darker line is the sewing line, so be sure **not** to cut on the darker line. Also, it is easier to line up the pieces if you follow through with the ruler leaving triangle points, rather than cutting off the tiny triangles on the points of the templates.

### **Assembling the Block**

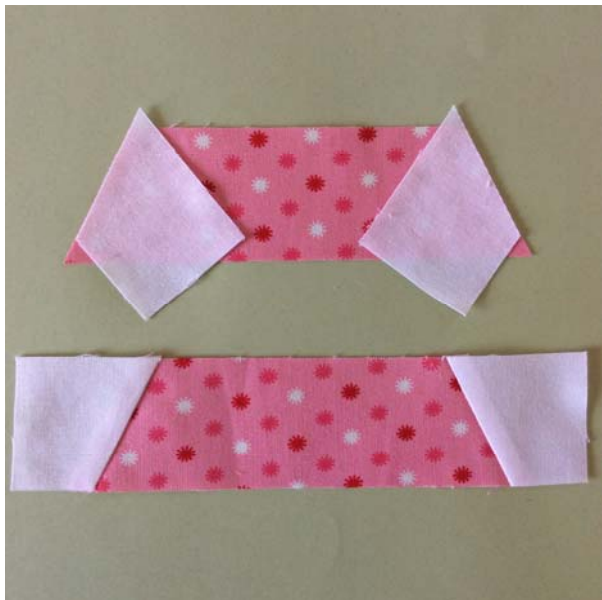
1. Align rectangle A perpendicular to the left corner of B. Draw a line from the top corner of A to the bottom corner where it aligns with B. Lay your C rectangle perpendicular to the right corner of B. Draw a line from the top corner of A to the bottom corner where it aligns with B. Stitch. Trim off excess to leave a ¼" seam allowance. Press seams out, towards the background. Finished B Unit should measure 1 ½" x 6 ½".



(Please note that the pattern photos show the pieces laid out and ready to stitch on the top, and the completed piece on the bottom).

2. Align the diagonal edge of L to the diagonal edge of M, being sure that the top corner of L is ¼" above the top of B, and the bottom corner of B is ¼" below the edge of L. Align the diagonal edge of D to the right side

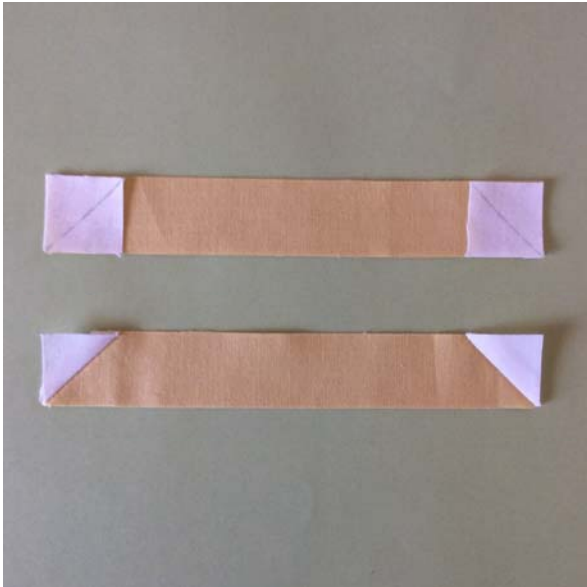
diagonal edge of B, being sure that the corner of D is  $\frac{1}{4}$ " above the top of B, and the bottom corner of B is  $\frac{1}{4}$ " below the edge of D. Stitch. Trim excess to leave a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Press seams in, toward B (pie filling). Finished M Unit should measure 2" x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".



3. Align the bottom of Unit B to the top of Unit M. Stitch. Press seams toward the M Unit. Finished Pie Filling Unit should measure  $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".



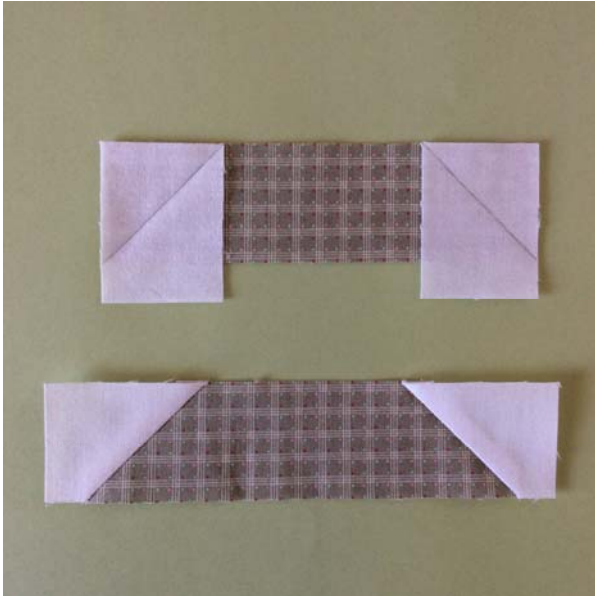
4. Draw a diagonal line across your two E squares. Place one square on each end of O. Stitch on the diagonal line. Trim excess to  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press out towards background. Finished Pie Crust Unit should measure 1" x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".



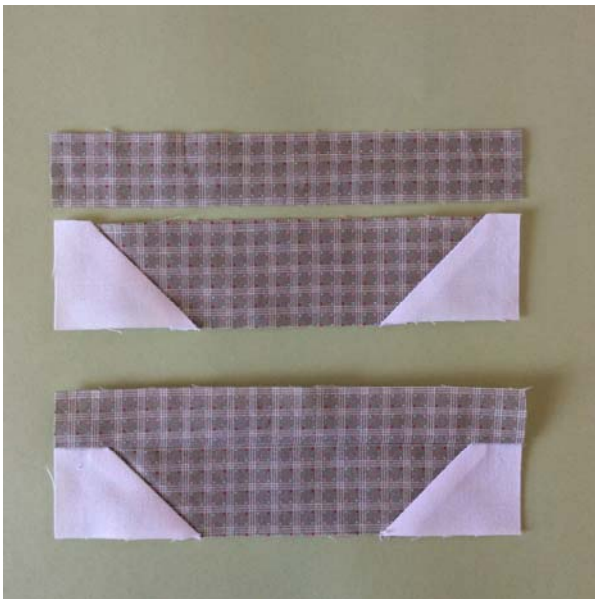
5. Align the bottom of the Pie Filling Unit to the top of the Pie Crust Unit. Stitch. Press seams down, toward the crust. Finished Pie Unit should measure  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".



6. Align your K rectangle perpendicular to the left corner of N. Draw a line from the top corner of K to the bottom corner where it aligns with N. Lay your G rectangle perpendicular to the right corner of N. Draw a line from the top corner of G to the bottom corner where it aligns with N. Stitch. Trim off excess to leave a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press seams out, towards the background. Finished N Unit should measure  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".



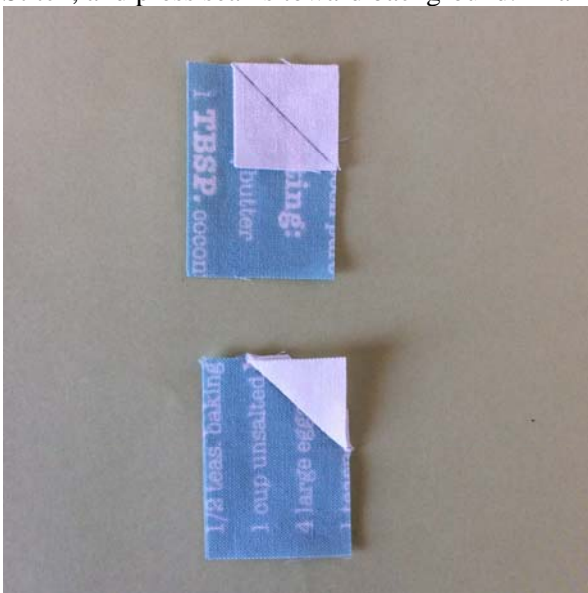
7. Align the bottom of F to the top of the N Unit. Stitch. Press seams up, toward F. Pie Pan Unit should measure 2" x 6 1/2".



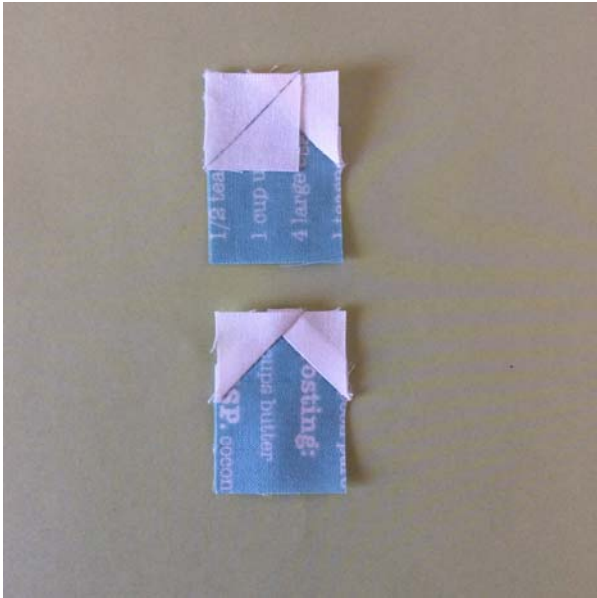
8. Align the bottom of the Pie Unit to the top of the Pie Pan Unit. Stitch. Press toward the bottom (pie pan). Pie Unit should measure 4 1/4" x 6 1/2".



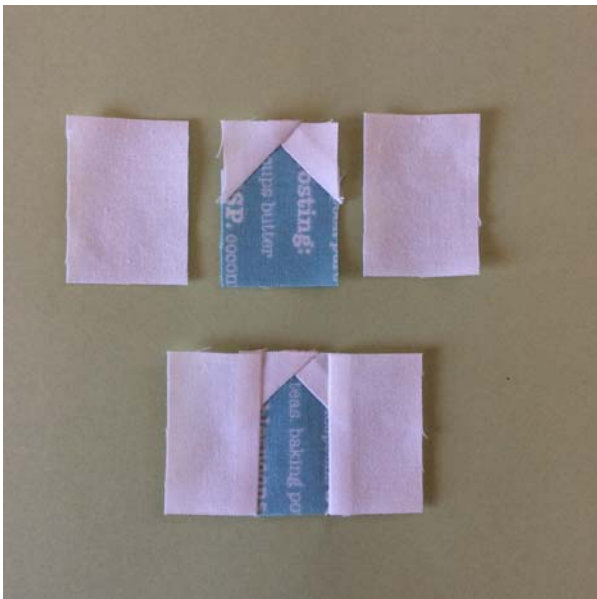
9. Draw a diagonal line across your four I squares. Place one I square on the top, right hand corner of Q. Stitch, and press seams toward background. Make 2.



10. Place one I square on the top left corner of Q. Stitch, and press toward the background. Make 2.

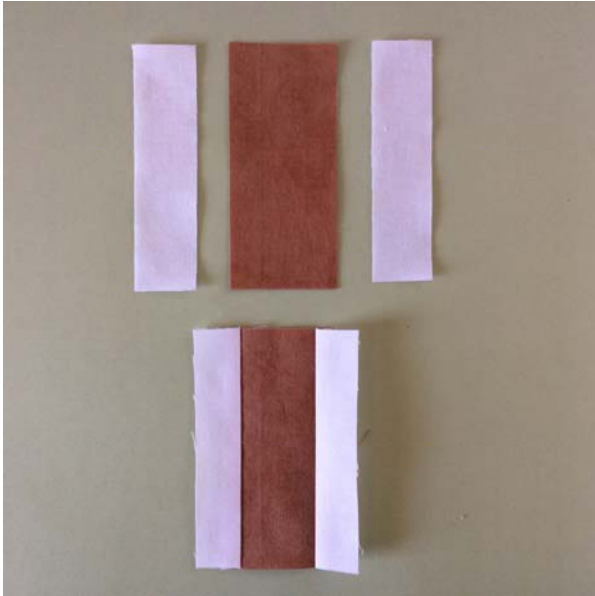


11. Place one H to the right side of the Q Unit. Stitch, and press seams toward the background. Place one H to the left side of the Q Unit. Stitch, and press toward the background. Make 2. Finished Handle Units should measure  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $2\frac{3}{4}$ ".

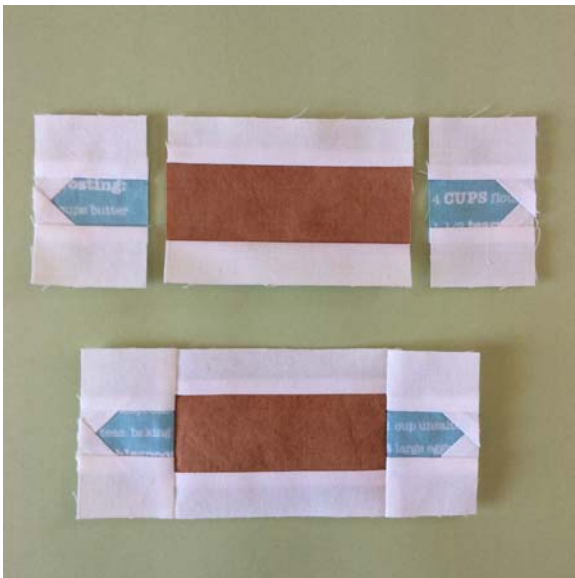


12. Align one J to the left side of P. Stitch, and press seams toward the background. Align one J to the right side of P. Stitch, and press toward the background. Finished P Unit should measure  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x 4".

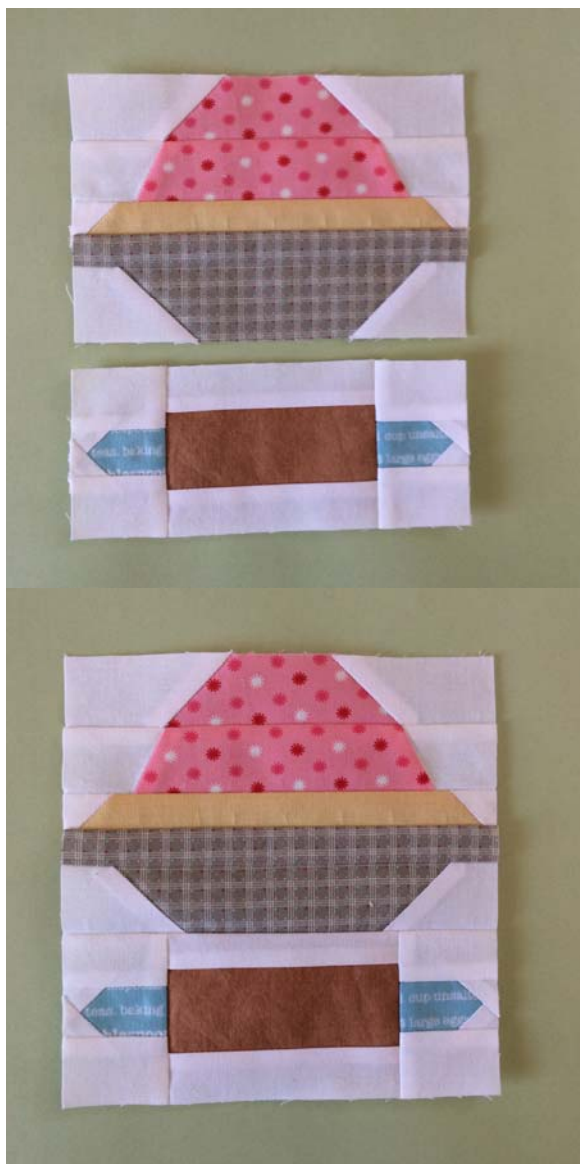




13. Align one Handle Unit to the left side of the P Unit. Stitch, and press seams toward the handle. Align one Handle Unit to the right side of the P Unit. Stitch, and press seams toward the handle. Finished Rolling Pin Unit should measure  $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".



14. Align the bottom of the Pie Unit to the top of the Rolling Pin Unit. Stitch, and press seams toward the rolling pin. The Pie Block should measure  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ".



15. For hot pads, align one 1 ½" x 6 ½" strip to the right side and one to the left side of the pie block. Stitch and press seams out.



16. Align one 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" strip on the top and one on the bottom of the pie block. Stitch, and press seams out. This unit should measure 8 1/2" x 8 1/2".





### **Embroidery**

1. Copy the “Baked With Love” onto Stick-n-Washaway (or you can trace with a pencil and light box). Cut the words out - 1/2” above and below the highest/lowest point of the letters and 3/4” from the outermost edge of the letters.



2. Peel off backing, and align with the 45 degree angle of the top of your pie filling for the “Baked” and “With”. Align the top of the “ove” in Love with the border seam.
3. Embroider using either a back stitch or a stem stitch (I used a stem stitch).

### **Quilting & Finishing**

1. Layer your backing, heat resistant batting, and your block (be sure your fabrics are facing right side out). Quilt as desired. I use painters tape to get a straight line, and did a simple cross-hatch quilting.

2. Cut your ric rac into 9" strips. Using an 1/8<sup>th</sup> inch seam allowance, tack the ric rac in place on the right and left side, and then the top and bottom of each block.
3. Machine stitch your binding to the top of each hot pad (I use a 2 1/4" width strip for binding). Hand-stitch the binding to the back.
4. Sew the three 1/2" buttons to the top of each pie (to resemble fresh berries on top)!
5. Optional Hanging Loop: To make 1/4" Bias Tape, cut 2 - 4 1/2" sections of your leftover binding. Open it and trim it to 1 1/4". Press in half. Then open it, and press each side, aligning it with the center iron crease line. Fold in half and press. Stitch a scant 1/8" along the side to seal the folded edge, and a scant 1/8" along the top and bottom edge. Secure to the back of each hot pad in the upper left corner with a button.

And, Voila! You've got a really cute set of new hot pads to use or give as a gift ;)!!
